




We Share Everything!

In this silly story Jeremiah and Amanda have trouble sharing with each other. The teacher has to continuously break them up and remind them to share EVERYTHING; however, she received a big surprise when Amanda and Jeremiah finally took her advice.

Before:

Before reading, tell the children a little bit about the story. Take a moment to ask questions about the cover of the book, “What are Jeremiah and Amanda doing on the cover? Do you think they should be fighting over a book?” Asking these questions will help spark interest in the children.

During:

While you are reading the book take some time to observe the illustrations and ask questions. Talk about what keeps happening between Jeremiah and Amanda and what the teacher keeps reminding them to do. Robert Munsch likes to use expressive words when describing a sound so take the time to really emphasize these words to the children.

Onomatopoeia in *We Share Everything*

What is onomatopoeia? Onomatopoeia is made up of two Greek words that stand for “the name (or sound) I make”. Some examples are:

Blumph!

Gawck!

Crash!

Ouch!

Owww!

AHHH!

Can you think of other examples of Onomatopoeia?

After:

Discuss the story. Ask Questions...

- What would Jeremiah do when Amanda wouldn't share?
- What did Amanda do when Jeremiah wouldn't share the blocks?
- What did the teacher always tell Jeremiah and Amanda to do?
- What items did they first start to share?
- Do you think the teacher meant clothes or just the toys?
